"MATHEWSON DOING WELL," SAYS DOCTOR

Pitcher's Physician at Saranac Gives Encouraging Report on Christy's Condition.

Syracuse, N. Y., Dec. 28.—Conflicting despatches, sent out from various places in New York state, from unauthorized sources, have, at various times during the year reported Christy Mathewson, "Big Six," a victim of the white plague as dying, as fully recovered, and then again that all hope had been given up for his recovery.

Mathewson, according to his physician, is doing as well as can be expected under the circumstances, and is a patient in "Santamoni," a private establishment at Saranac Lake, in the heart of the Adirondacks.

One report circulated recently is true. Doctor Packard says that one lung of the great star has collapsed and is useless. The other, however, is functioning just as properly as it did when "Big Six" was throwing 'em over the plate at the Polo Grounds.

Doctor Packard says: "I have high hopes for the ultimate recovery of Mathewson. So has 'Big Six' himself. Reports circulated that he has surrendered to despondency and abandoned his fight are entirely unfounded.
