### La MARQUISE de FONTENOY

Sir Francis Campbell, Blind Knight, Who Has Done Much for the Sightless—The Champs Elysees in Paris

That brave and good knight, Sir Francis J. Campbell, has at length, at the age of eighty, found it expedient to lighten his labors. It is said that he is about to retire from the principality of the Normal College for the Blind, with which he has been connected for forty years. Born blind himself, or afflicted with blindness at so early an age that he can have no conception of the sense of sight, he has devoted the whole of his life to the improvement of the condition of those who are similarly afflicted, to make them self-supporting, and to demonstrate the fact that their deprivation still leaves open to them many fields of activity.

When it is recalled that among his own favorite recreations are "riding, rowing, traveling, cycling and mountaineering"—reaching Alpine peaks seldom attained by those gifted with sight—it will begin to be understood how thoroughly and how truly, true grit he has pursued his life work.

When King Edward, in 1909, conferred a knighthood upon him, everyone agreed he was a friend all over the world—that never was honored more fittingly. Thanks to his training and his exertions, hundreds of blind men in England are now self-supporting as organists and musicians.

He was educated in Nashville, Tenn., and at the University of Tennessee, being subsequently connected with the musical conservatories of Boston, of Leipzig, Germany, and of Tamsig and Kullak, in Berlin. In Boston he was resident superintendent and musical director of Perkins' Institution for the Blind. In 1871, together with the Rev. John W. Westminister and other philanthropists, he established the Royal Normal College and Academy of Music for the Blind at Norwich. In the eastern district of London, with which institution he has been connected ever since.

Bearing in mind the French saying that "there is nothing sacred to a sapper," it is in this case an engineer, it is with a feeling of apprehension that I read in the Paris papers of the "improvements" that are proposed to be made in that delightful avenue known as the Champs Elysees. In former times it was known as the Avenue de Verdun. One day Louis XIV., when quite an old man, having been wheeled farther than usual in his chair, was filled with delight when he found himself under the great lime trees, and cried: "Could ever the Elysian fields be more divinely cool and balsamiferous than this adorable place!" These words were naturally repeated, from month to month, and from being a sort of nickname, the great avenue came to be known in regular parlance as the Champs Elysees.

In 1784 the Duc d'Antin, minister of Louis XV., gave orders to the architect Blondin to clear away the bushes, ditches, and heaps of stones which disfigured the end of the Tuilleries Gardens. Furthermore, he designed and carried out his plans for the Place de la Concorde. In commemoration, his name still distinguishes one of the alleyways of the Champs Elysees. His successor, M. de Marigny, also had an avenue named after him, in recognition of his having given to the city of Paris the site of the offices and outhouses of the "Hotel d'Evreux."

of his real estate deal. As a matter of fact it really was a clever transaction, from a business point of view, for the Coura la Reine immediately became the fashionable resort of the most aristocratic society, and anyone who wished to exhibit a new dress, a new hat, or a new equestrian for the first time, always sought the Coura la Reine for the purpose.

The courts were separated from the Grand Courts, opposite the Palace of the Tuilleries, by a wide moat, and some narrow streets, or ways, which bore a very evil reputation—resembling that of the so-called "Alastia," in ancient London. It was not safe for a respectable citizen to venture into these alleys. He ran the risk of being held up by footpads and robbed of his pocketbook and other valuables; fortunate, indeed, if he escaped bodily injury, for life was held cheaply in the vicinity, and it was no uncommon incident for the "watch"—guardians of the peace—in the course of their rounds, to find those of the lower ranks of life, who had chosen the spot for the purpose of fighting "paid duels," but sometimes the victims of the law, who were held up by the authorities and turned their attention to the neighborhood again. The result should be watched with interest by those who are acquainted with the history of that portion of the gay capital.

### Daily Hints For the Cook

#### FLORENTINE STEWED BEEF.

Cut an onion and fry it with three leaves of rosemary in an ounce of butter. When slightly brown add two pounds of beef, mutton or veal, cut in two inch pieces, sprinkle with a little salt and fry for a few minutes, then add the contents of half a can of tomatoes and a tablespoon of Worcestershire sauce. Cover the steppan and simmer for two hours, adding a little stock or boiling water or the juice of the tomatoes if the solid portion gets too dry. If liked a clove of garlic with one cut may be added for five minutes only; longer will make the flavor too strong.

#### GENOISE PASTRY.

Weight four eggs, beat and mix with an equal quantity of granulated sugar and flour. Pound up a quarter of a pound of butter. Beat the butter with the sugar and flour. Add the yolks of the eggs one by one, and beat well. Add the whites of the eggs, beaten to a stiff froth, and beat again. Bake in a shallow tin in a water bath for ten minutes. Remove and cool. Spread with jam or marmalade. Sold by all grocers.

#### NEAPOLITAN ALMOND CAKES

Blanche an equal quantity of sweet and bitter almonds (the sweet are merely the ordinary table almonds) and dry them in the oven; then pound to a paste and add an equal quantity of powdered sugar; beat all together with the well whipped white of an egg. Shape the pastry into little balls about the size of a pigeon's egg, put them on a sheet of stiff white paper and bake in a very slow oven. When properly done they should be light, delicate and delicious.

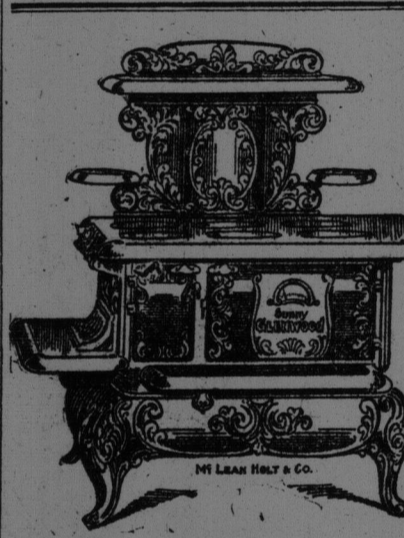

It seems to me that there is at least one quality which is daily becoming less common among us, and that is accuracy. This is the day of big things, of large undertakings, and broad outlooks and general culture, but it is most emphatically not the day of accurate knowledge. If you will take the pains to notice, you will find that the average person knows a great many things loosely, but very little exactly. Indeed, it seems to be very difficult for the average person to be exact and definite about anything.

I was anxious to hear all about a certain kind of work which was being done by a woman in a neighboring city. I was told that a friend of mine knew this woman well and could tell me all about it. When I went to interview her on the subject, she corroborated this. Oh, yes, she knew all about it; she had lived next door to the woman for six months, she assured me glibly. It sounded hopeful, but when we came down to definite facts, I was less delighted for the following is a fair sample of the accuracy of her information: "How much could Mrs. A. usually make at this work?" "Well, I'm not exactly sure. It was either thirty dollars a week, or thirty a month. I've heard several times, but I can't seem to remember which."

A friend of mine was visiting in a city some miles from home. To get to the depot from her hostess' home she was obliged to travel on the trolley car. When it came time for her to go home, she planned on a certain train which would get her back to town in season for an important engagement, and then asked what time she could get a trolley car to take her to the train. Her friend assured her that the trolley car, which went past their street at ten minutes after the hour, would give her ample time. Unfortunately, ten minutes after the hour, she missed her train, and could not keep the important engagement.

The man who wears a watch that he is sure is exactly right is a rare avie, and a popular one, too, for all the inaccurate watch carriers are constantly availing themselves of his accuracy. And in at least nine homes out of ten, if you ask: "Is that clock exactly right?" you will be told: "No, I think it is a little fast—don't know just how much," or "I'm not sure—I'm afraid it loses a little," or something of that sort.

To be sure, not knowing the exact time of day, or the time a trolley car goes is not wicked, although it certainly causes infinite trouble, but things like these are indications of our national trend towards inexactness and inaccuracy. There is an expression: "I want what I want," which is said to be characteristic of the American people. I wish it could also be said of us that we know what we know when we know it.

In the home, in the school, in public life, in business life, in professional life, in our children, in ourselves, it certainly behooves us to fight this growing tendency to be satisfied with careless and inaccurate knowledge.

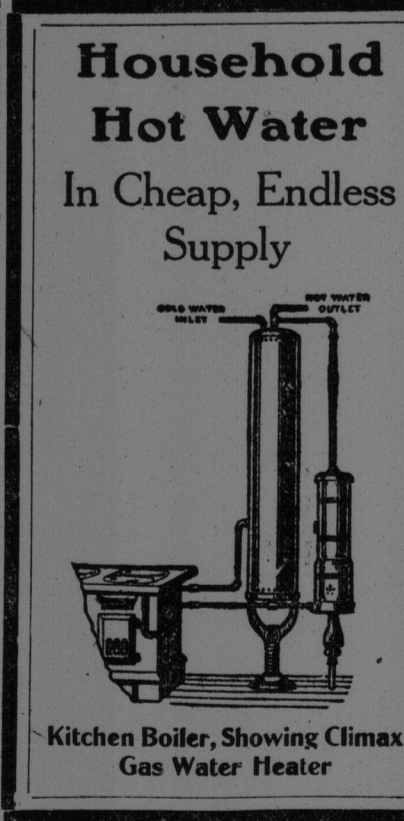
