Ministers of every religious denomination in this Province can solemnize Matrimony, provided they have been regularly ordained according to the rites of such Church as they profess to be minister of. They must take the Oath of Allegiance to his Majesty, and obtain a certificate from the Magistrates, in Quarter Sessions, of their having been ordained. No persons can legally be married except by Banns, which are to be published in the respective places of public worship on three different Sundays, or by Licence.
