The bunches are then got to tide water, which is done by railroads, rivers, and canals, or when these are not available, on the heads of women. It is a common sight in Jamaica to see a string of a dozen or more women, each with a large bunch of bananas on her head, and these they will carry for several miles without stopping. The Jamaica negroes are educated from childhood to carry everything on their heads. School children are seen playing tag with books and even ink bottles on their heads. When a Jamaica belle goes to a social function she carries her shoes on her head and puts them on her feet when she gets there. Everything from a postage stamp to a Saratoga trunk is carried in this way.
