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THE MILLION LEGGED HUMAN LEECH OF THE UNDER WORLD

Vagabondia Now Fully Organized With Departments, Codes, Camps and Secret Symbols—Versatile Criminals at Head.

Sociologists, recently investigating the tramp problem of this country, have come to the interesting conclusion that Vagabondia has followed the national tendency and has become, to all intents and purposes, a trust. It is fully organized, with districts, tenements, boards of directors, meeting places, grip, passwords, and a highly developed sign language.

Of this new trust it may be said literally in words of the immortal Col. Sellers of "Gilded Age" memory there is a million in it. It is estimated that there are that many tramps in the United States, at least within live according to the code of the order. For years criminally have been steadily working like a leaven through the mass, until now every crime from murder to chicken stealing can be found on the police docket opposite the name of some vagabond. As in other trusts of the predatory variety, the most accomplished and versatile criminals are at the head. These are undeveloped pages who help their masters along until they have gained enough experience to be yeggers themselves. They may be called the lieutenants of the industry.

The third class is the "bindle" life is the old-fashioned tramp who just drifts about on an occasional raid on a hen coop. Last is the "shaved stiff," who will work when he can, but has been driven into Vagabondia by changing industrial conditions to which he could not adapt himself, or by some other misfortune. Look at any "bread line" such as are formed in New York, and you will see "shaved stiff" in the process of formation. A "gay cat" may time become a "yegg," but a "bindle" or a "shaved stiff" does. On the other hand the latter often passes into the "bindle" class. Both types must, however, conform to the regulations of their superiors, and that is where the peculiar sign language figures most strongly.

THE TRAMP'S SIGN LANGUAGE.
The purpose of the sign language is warning, guidance, and specific information for the commission of crime.

Part of the "bindle" or "shaved stiff" duty to the organization is to contribute this information. You see it in the strange market places, scrawled in fences and bars or houses to walls, on trees and stones. By it a district may be marked out, a place for exploitation, with full details as to disadvantages and advantages as the secret reports of a standard call trust agent, say, to his superiors.

There are few who have seen these signs, crosses, and circles, and circles and crude drawings and have not wondered what they meant. Prof. Wallace Estimator of Michigan university, made a study of the system recently during a tramp tour, and Chief of Police Charles J. McCabe of Poughkeepsie, N. Y., has made analysis of the symbols a hobby. From their observations a lucid explanation can be made of the most important. Those who hereafter see the figures scrawled about their property will know whether they are protected or marked for slaughter.

were killed on railroads and 25,236 maimed. Two-thirds of this astounding number were tramps.

James J. Hill, who by the way, first christened the new Vagabondia the "tramp trust," asserts that \$25,000,000 in damage is done annually to the railroads of the United States by the tramps, both wilfully and carelessly. He also points out that their organization is growing, and that it only needs a really great leader to make it the most formidable criminal provision the country has ever had to face.

"No other predatory corporation or combination of them could equal the menace," he says.

Finally, just as legislation is being urged in all states to curb the activity of the industrial combinations, so is the need of legislation that will wipe out the tramp problem under consideration. Until the need of the bread line and the prison have vanished, it is not likely that the tramp will go, but it is possible to break up his organization.
