### THE CANADIAN TRADE SHOWS LARGE GAIN

#### Final Figures for Year Ending April 30th Show Prosperous Condition of Dominion.

Ottawa, July 21.—Final figures on Canadian trade for the year ended April 30, total \$1,679,970,000 as compared with \$1,373,611,833 for the preceding year. Exports totalled \$678,487,817 and imports \$1,001,482,183, showing an increase of eighteen per cent. in exports and a decrease of five per cent. in imports.

### THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at the office of any Local Agent of Dominion Lands (not sub-agent) on certain conditions.
