## BANK CLEARINGS FOR THE PAST WEEK

St. John.

The clearings for the week ending April 9th, were \$1,521,683; for the corresponding week last year, \$1,569,389.

Halifax.

Halifax, April 9.—The Halifax bank clearings for the week ended today were \$2,160,587.17 and for the corresponding week last year, \$1,854,421.55.

Winnipeg.

Winnipeg, April 9.—Bank clearings for the week ended April 9 were \$24,110,918, compared with \$27,246,844 for the corresponding week last year, and \$22,647,909 for the corresponding week 1912.

Montreal.

Montreal, April 9.—Montreal bank clearings for the week ended today again show a decrease, the total for the six days' business being \$2,570,945 under that for the corresponding period a week ago, representing a decline of approximately 5 per cent.

The figures for the three years follow: 1914, \$50,558,053; 1913, \$53,228,998; 1912, \$40,326,128.

Toronto.

Toronto, April 9.—There was a good increase in local bank clearings for the week. The figures with comparison: Week ended today, \$44,874,647. Last week, \$39,600,334; corresponding week, 1913, \$44,411,036; corresponding week, 1912, (four days), \$30,113,605; corresponding week 1911, \$37,427,237.

Ottawa.

Ottawa, April 9.—Bank clearings for the week ended today were \$5,255,246, compared with \$3,820,576 for the same period last year.

Quebec.

Quebec, April 9.—Bank clearings for the week ended April 9 were \$3,358,139; corresponding week last year, \$3,063,262.

## LATE NEWS FROM COTTON MARKET

New York, April 9.—Tomorrow will be a holiday in all the world's exchanges. There was considerable cotton for sale at the start, part of it for a quick turn, and after opening steady at a decline of 2 to 5 points, active months sold about 7 to 9 points net lower.

Offerings were well enough taken on this decline to steady prices, and after selling movements rallied of 3 to 4 points occurred from the lowest. No aggressive support developed, however, and the market became easier when some of the bankers who had been buyers earlier in the week were moderate sellers of July, though not necessarily for the same account as their previous purchases. There was nothing in today's reports to throw any fresh light on the existing situation in the old crop positions.

Temp's are unchanged and low in the month with prospect for clearing and warmer conditions over the holiday.
