Austria Making Desperate Effort To Take Mount Lowcen The Gibraltar of the Adriatic

New York, Jan. 4.—A news agency despatch from Rome today says:

A desperate and most important struggle for mastery of the Adriatic is now raging near the Austrian naval base of Cattaro, between the combined Austrian naval and land forces and Montenegrins.

The Austrians are making a determined attempt to capture Mount Lowcen, the Gibraitar of the Adriatic. Its retention by the Montenegrins threatens the Austrian hold on Cattaro.

Since the beginning of the war Austria has made the Cattaro harbor a naval base for operations in the Adriatic, the Aegean and the Mediterranean. Cattaro is absolutely impregnable from Mount Lowcen where the Montenegrins a year ago installed heavy artillery.

For six days the Austrians have been attempting to drive the Montenegrins from this position. While Austrian troops are attacking on the slopes from Ruskovagora, Gherbal and other points, the Austrian warships in Cattaro harbor are flercely bombarding the Montenegrin positions.
