visited 211 vessels lying in the stream and thus supplied Two THOU-SAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY men with suitable reading matter. Mr. Potter has also occasionally held an afternoon service on board, and thus opportunity has been afforded for personal conversation with the men, which we trust may lead to saving results. In these ways there have been distributed over TWENTY THOUSAND tracts and papers in the English language, and Two Thousand in Foreign tongues for which we tender our thanks to the B. A. B. & Tract Society.

A Cottage meeting is held every Friday evening at No. 15 Dresdon Row which is well attended and supported by several of onr active members and we hope to open one at the North end
