

# Three teams share first in Majors

The race for first place in the Suburban Majors ten-pin league at Applewood Bowl reached an impasse last week.

Three-teams — American

Motors, Marmac Jewellers and Applewood — each grabbed a share for the top spot. Only one week remains in the first series of the season.

Applewood took the biggest step of the co-leaders, sweeping three games from All-Seasons Travels.

Roy Williams was the big man for Anthony's with a 532 triple. Dan Hubbs and Dan Snider both cracked 500 in fine losing efforts.

Larry Nicols turned in the hottest performance of the night to spark Davies Furniture to a 2-1 win over Sunworthy Wallcoverings.

Nicols rolled a sizzling 596 set and had help from

teammates Ted Young (586) and Reg Black (528).

Jim Hillis with 566 and Ed Baliva with 532 were the best of the Sunworthy kegglers.

Pepsi Cola stayed within striking distance of first place when they took two games from Peel Taxi.

Harry Linthorne led the way for Pepsi with a 552 triple. Dan Armstrong with 544 and Jim Cockwell with 529 were high men in the Peel attack.

John Prochuk, with 572. Lou Mills with 538 and

Bob Lancaster with 512 all found the range as Marmac outscored Atlas Coin two games to one.

Bob Feddery with 553 and Hugh McRae with 515 were the best of the Atlas shooters.

Luigi's Tailors regained their championship form of last year as they crushed Osin Construction and hockey star Murray Oliver 3-0.

Nick Maracinni with a 592 set was high man for the winners Brian McLelland with 572 and Dave Billingsley with 508 aided the Luigi cause.

Gino Martini had a fine 520 for Osin.

Rexall Drugs had three bolers in the 500-plus range but still lost two games to Army, Navy and Air Force.

Walter Plesh with 523, Nich Dean with 510 and Jim Barnes with 508 did their best for the luckless Rexall squad.

Ted Cox with 517 and Floyd Hiltz with 510 were the sharpshooters for the servicemen.

In the team standings, Applewood, Marmac and American Motors are knotted with 14 points, one-half point ahead of fourth-place Peel Taxi.

Atlas and Pepsi each have 13 points. Davies Furniture has 11, Sunworthy and Army, Navy and Air Force are tied with 10. Luigi's have 9½, Anthony's seven, Osin six and Rexall five.


