J27985, P/O Rutledge, R.W., while flying Harvard No. 2778 was forced to carry out a forced via landing at Ironsides, Quebec, with undercarriage retracted, because of engine failure. Category of accident was "D-2". No injury to pilot. Being further investigated at Repair Depot.		
	December 29th 1943		"Al Cowan's Tramps", from Cotton Club, New York City, played dance music in the Recreation Hall before a large audience, which included the Commanding Officer, Wing Commander J.G. Stephenson.		
	December 30th 1943		Overcast, intermittent light snow.
