## Wheat Board; appointment; increase of salaries

23. The Minister of Trade and Commerce said that Dr. T.W. Grindley wished to resign as a member of the Wheat Board about August 1st, 1950. The personnel of the Board was a matter of great importance in view of the functions it performed. In order to secure the best possible appointment to the vacancy it was desirable that the salaries of the Chairman and members be increased.

A recommendation was submitted for appointment to the Board.

- 24. The Cabinet, after discussion:
- (a) agreed that, effective August 1st, 1950, the salary of the Chairman of the Wheat Board be \$20,000 and of each of the two Commissioners, \$17,500; and
- (b) approved the appointment of William Riddell, Esquire, as a member of the Wheat Board effective August 1st, 1950;

Orders in Council to be passed accordingly.
