REPRESENTATIVES.

Edwin Larwill, Esq., was the first Representative of Kent. After the division he continued to represent the County from 1854 to 1857. Arch. McKellar was elected in 1857, since which time he has represented the County.

The first election, for the Legislative Council, for the Western Division, took place in 1856, when Colonel Prince was elected. He resigned, in 1861, and was succeeded by Sir Allan McNab; and, on his demise, in 1862, the Hon. Walter McCrea was elected, and now represents the Division.
