

## THE QUEEN AND THE ROYAL FAMILY.

Her Majesty, Alexandra Victoria, Queen of Great Britain and Ireland, born May 21, 1819; succeeded William IV. June 20, 1837; crowned June 28, 1838; married Feb. 10, 1840, to her cousin, H. R. H. Prince Albert of Saxo-Coburg, who died on the 14th December, 1861. The issue of the marriage are—

Princess Louise Victoria Alexandra Dagnair, born Feb. 20, 1867; H. R. H. Princess Victoria Alexandra Olga Mary, born July 6, 1868; and H. R. H. Princess Marie Charlotte Mary Victoria, born Nov. 26, 1869.

H. R. H. Alice Maud Mary, born April 25, 1843; married July 1, 1862, to Prince Louis of Hesse; and has issue, living, one son and four daughters.

H. R. H. Helena Augusta Victoria, born May 25, 1846; married July 5, 1866, to H. R. H. Prince Christian of Augustenbourg, has issue two sons and two daughters.

H. R. H. Louise Caroline Alberta, born March 18, 1848; married March 21, 1871, to the Marquis of Lorne.
