HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the North-west Territories, excepting 8 and 5g, which has not been homestended, or reserved to provide wood tols for settlers, or for other purposes, may it homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter sec-tion of 180 acres, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at the total land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homested desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioned of Inmigration, Winnipag, or the Local Agent for Entry the district in which the land is situate, receive and the other control of the Commission of the Commission of the Commission of Inmigration, Winnipag, or the Local Agent for Inmigration with the district in which the land is situate, receive and the Commission of the Commis

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for homestead is required by the provisions of the comminen Lands Act and the amendments hereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:—

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make deceased or any person who is eligible to make Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a honestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in themanner prescribed by this Act, and has obtained entering for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second-homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 20 acres substantially femoed.

Every homestcader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homestcader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Impector. Before making applica-tion for patent the settler must give six months to the commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to
