John Bunyan's Blind Daughter.

JOHN BUNYAN was born at Elstow, within a mile of Bedtord (France) a mile of Bedford (England) in the year

1628. He was by trade a tinker, and one day as he was going through Bedford looking for work, he overheard two godly women talking together of what God had done for their souls. This conversation was blessed to him, making him think of his sins, and he was at length led to believe on Jesus Christ and be saved. At the age of twenty-five he joined the Baptist Church, and soon after commenced to preach the Gospel. He continued preaching for about six years, when in 1660 he was arrested and cast into pris-

on, his crime the Church of England. John Bunyan was sent to Bedford Jail, where he remained a prisoner In 1672 he was released from prison, and lived in custody more or less strict for twelve years. until 1688, preaching the Gospel faithfully.

While in this prison he wrote the "Pilgrim's Progress."
