

That is said to have been the largest importation of cattle of any breed ever made into the United States was purchased recently in the Brockvilled district of Ontario. Had it not been for the fact that only one breed of cattle—Holsteins—were common in the district the sale would never have taken place. Mr. Thatcher, who purchased these cattle for the lowand Stock Farm, had been advised by Prof. W. J. Kennedy, of the lowa Agricultural College, to visit Brockville in his search for good cattle. Prof. Kennedy had gained his information by following the Live Stock advertisements in Farm and Dairy. Of these S2 cattle only one reacted to the Tuberculin test.
