

The Metropolitan Railway inter erecting a steel bridge over the Don at Thornhill.—The Victoria Industrial School Board will proceed at once with the erection of a new building at Mimico, the government having granted \$10,000 for the purpose.—The Scarborough Electric Railway is about to be extended to Highland Creek, a distance of five miles. The portion of the road already constructed will be overhauled and improved where necessary. It is also announced that the extension of the Metropolitan Railway from Newmarket to Jackson's Point will proceed forthwith.—Tenders will be invited immediately for the new Berkeley street fire hall.—The Greer, Dickson Co., manufacturers of office furnishings, Minneapolis, and the Avery Sampling Co., of Cleveland, are considering the establishment of branch factories in this city.—Tenders are wanted at 107 Lippincott street for brick work of houses.—The congregation of the Blessed Redeemer have decided to erect a new church on McCaul street.—The Works Committee have appointed a sub-committee to report on the question of submitting to the electors a by-law providing for a trunk sewer.—It is announced that a site has been chosen on which to build the proposed barracks for this city.—The city engineer has reported that the cost of the stone work necessary for construction of proposed lake drive along the water front from Bathurst street to the Lake Shore road would be \$160,000.—The city engineer has recommended the construction of a six inch water main on Chestnut Park road, at cost of \$1,510, also concrete sidewalk on Brunswick avenue, east side, College to Ulster, cost \$1,204; Ottawa street, both sides, Shaftesbury avenue to Summerhill avenue, cost \$317; McCaul street, west side, St. Patrick to Baldwin, cost \$1,112.—The Canada Permanent Association has sold the property at 226 Simcoe street to a real estate broker, who will build a three-storey residence thereon.—Tenders are wanted at 403 Perth avenue for carpenter work and plumbing.—Geo. W. Gouinlock, architect, Temple Building, is receiving tenders this week for all trades in connection with a large warehouse building, corner Simcoe and Pearl sts., for the Clark Lithographic Co.—Building per-

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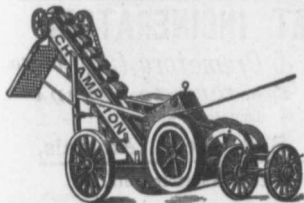
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
