A TIMELY ARTICLE

"A Catholic should realize that he is not only a member of a parish, but of a world-wide organization; a living organism, in which Christ is the head and the Holy Father is His Vicar on earth."

With these forcible words Father J. Barker, C. S. P., concludes his article "Life and Literature," contributed to the Catholic World which he edits.
