The department of agriculture has received an order from the war office for 1000 more tons of Canadian flour to be shipped to South Africa. This makes 2,914 tons of flour sent to the Cape.

A rifle factory is to be erected somewhere in Canada at a cost of about \$3,000,000. The company has a contract with the Australian government to supply fifty thousand small arms at a cost of \$1,500,000.

Gen. Botha reports that he has yet 24,000 men in arms. Where do they come from?

Invitations to attend the coronation have been sent to the Prime Ministers of Canada and Australia, and the Premiers of the different Provinces will also be invited. Colonel troops will also take part in the ceremonies.

A field hospital corps is to be organized in Canada and sent to South Africa. The officers will consist of one lieutenant-colonel, one major, one captain and two lieutenants. Here's a good chance for our young "medico's" who have a "pull" with the powers that be.
