Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations,

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may home-stead a quarter school, Naskatche Dominion laid in Manitoba, Naskatche van or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominiot Lands Agency (out not Sub-Agency.) on certain conditions.


