MR. TARTE AT THE SOO.

Mr . Tarte was at Sault Ste Marie at the dedication of the Clergue power canal, and there met at the banquet table a large number of prominent men of the United States,

After alluding in a jocular manner to the fact that his colleagues had thrown him out of the cabinet for his recent utterances on the tariff question, Mr, Tarte caused a small if they would mind him giving them a piece of his mind. Cries of "No, no." Mr. Tarte then went on to say that the Americans had treated Canada unfairly. Canada had tried to negotiate a tariff, but our neighbors would not be friendly. We are closing an epoch of apathy and indifference, and before long we may bring you to time by putting up our fence. That, I think, would have a good result. We are not as big as you, but you cannot swallow us in one mouthful. National pride is running high in Canada, and we are going to protect ourselves, and in the doing so we will bring you to time. We have a country full of natural resources. We have iron, gold, lumber, and magniiron and gold and lumber, don't you? You are joint owners with us in the great waterways, but we are sole owners of the St. Lawrence route. Our waterway from Chicago to Liverpool is 500 miles shorter than your route, and I think you will use our waterway when it is completed, although I don't care whether you do or not. There is a strong national sentiment

on this subject. Whatever Mr. Tarte's critics may say, the above is the right position for Canadians to take. The dismissed minister may be open to criticism in many ways; but his pro-Canadianism must strike a responsive chord in the hearts of all Canadians who have the upbuilding of the country at heart. Cravenness and subserviency will never win respect from anyone. and Mr. Tarte's independent utterences will heighten respect for him and his country in the minds of those who listened to him.

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE ON TRIAL.

An Interesting case is about to be tried in New York where parents permitted their 7-year-old child to die by refusing to provide a proper physitheria. The parents were Christian Scientists and employed a Christian Science "healer" with the fatal results that followed. Medical men Itestified that had the child received proper medicines the chances would have been greatly in favor of its

The grand jury sitting on the case handed down indictments charging parents and the "healer" with manslaughter in the second degree, in causing the child's death by neglect. There is a section in the penal code which states that homicide is manslaughter in the second degree when it is committed without any design to effect death by any act, procurement or culpable negligence, of any person, which does not constitute the crime of murder in the first or second degree nor manslaughter in the first degree. It is stated that the indictments for manslaughter are the first that have ever been brought against Christian Scientists. The punishment for manslaughter in the second degree is a term of imprisonment not exceeding fifteen years, or a fine not exceeding \$1,000, or

The case is a very important one, and will in all probability be tried early this month. It will be looked upon all overy the country as a first case as to the rights of Christian Scientists. It will be a contest between science and faith, on the one

hand, and blind faith on the other. The grand jury presentment in connection with the case calls attention to what it deems a fact, namely
