Halifax, N. S., Dec. 30.—Eight hundred and seventy-five passengers salling on the Empress of Ireland were detained here from 10.30 o'clock Saturday until 6.15 in the evening, awaiting the arrival of the Canadian mail, the last car of which reached the ship's side at 5.45 o'clock. The Empress left St. John at 4.30 Friday afternoon and made Halifax in 18 hours. The detention here on account of the mails, together with the loss of time caused through the deviation from the regular course in making this port, caused a total delay of about 15 hours to nearly a thousand people.
