After dinner of course the delegates felt better not only on account of the well satisfied inner man but because the sun shone brightly and the commodious and comfortable church was rapidly filling with an intelligent and interesting audience.

The liquor interest has established itself here and proposes to stay. This is a perpetual menace to the peace and prosperity of the people. Pastor Hinson, of the Baptist church, and other pastors and Temperance workers, are striving to hold the flood in check, and are doing a noble work.
