PANIC STRICKEN.

Not satisfied with traducing Mr. Foster the Patriot indites a diatribe against the Conservative party, past and present.

No doubt, this burst of slanderous invective against the Conservatives in general, is indulged in with the hope of diverting public attention from innumerable scandals and stealings of the present Government.

In its report of what Premier Hazard said at the Liberal meeting in this city on Friday evening last, the Patriot made him say that, while in Ottawa, he had obtained a refund of two years' interest improperly kept out of our subsidy on account of our share towards the cost of the Hillsborough Bridge.
