The Council met this evening at adjournment after the first meeting. Moved by Mr. McMillan on July 2nd instant that the office of health officer for 1890 be let by tender to the meeting of Council, the councilman formerly appointed said office not being raised by the Council.

Courtesy offered by Mr. McMillane, by Mr. Wilson that the Council now adjourn, to meet again on Thursday the 22nd Sept. next. Council adjourned.
