

OVERWHELMING CALAMITY

75,000 Persons Engulphed by Volcanic Disturbances!

Java and Other Islands Stricken—Alarm-Frenzies in the Heavens—Pillars and Clouds of Flame—Appalling Ruins—Sudden and Rapid Disappearance of Mountains, Islands, and Towns—Immense Tidal Waves—Streams of Burning Lava and Scoria—The Locality Fully Described—Supposed Effects on the Atlantic Seaboard.

BATAVIA, Aug. 27.—The volcanic eruptions in Java began on the island of Krakatoa, in the strait of Sunda, 100 miles from the coast of Java. On Saturday night and Sunday the disturbances had extended beneath the waters of the strait, causing great waves and a rise of twenty degrees in the temperature. At sea the disturbance was felt 500 miles away. By noon, Maka Meru, the largest volcano in Java, was in violent eruption shortly after Gunung, the crater of which is the largest in the world; and fifteen of the other craters in Java were either in active eruption or seriously threatened. At dusk, Gunung sent out streams of white ash, sulphurous mud, with an explosion of cinders and stones, which carried death to all about the valley. The clouds were charged with electricity and fifteen water spouts were seen simultaneously. The inhabitants fled terror-stricken, and a hundred were buried under houses, which were crushed by masses of rocks and mud. Gunung Tengger, which had not had an eruption since 1800, shot out great red-hot boulders, which crushed through the huts of the Chinese fishermen. Fissures and yawning chasms appeared in the fertile valleys, which were covered with flourishing plantations where now there is but mud, stone and lava-covered fields. The destruction is probably so complete that probably not a single crop in Java is saved. At the entrance to Batavia was a large group of houses, occupied by Chinamen. This portion is entirely swept away. Of 25,000 Chinese about 5,000 were saved; of 3,500 Europeans 800 perished. At Anjer, the European and American quarters were first overwhelmed by rocks, mud lava; then the waters came up and swallowed the ruins, leaving nothing, and causing a loss of 200 lives. Bantam, once a prosperous native city is now abandoned by Europeans. Many years ago it was entirely covered by water, when 1,200 to 1,500 were drowned. The island of Serang is completely inundated and not a soul remains. At Cheribon the loss of life and property was considerable. Buteuzorg suffered very seriously, as did Samarang, Jogyakarta, Sourakera, and Sourabaya, while meagre reports from lesser towns indicate their loss to be great in proportion. The last advice state that the eruptions are continuing, but their violence is abated. It is somewhat feared that the disaster will be the most fearful ever known.

BATAVIA, Java, Aug. 29.—[Afternoon].—The towns of Anjer, Ijringine and Kelokobong were destroyed by the volcanic eruption. All the lighthouses in the straits have disappeared, and where the mountain of Kramatan formerly stood the sea now flows. The aspect of Sunda Straits is also much changed and navigation is dangerous. Since noon on Wednesday everything has been quiet. The sky is clear, and communication with Serang is restored. The temperature fell ten degrees on Monday, but is now normal. The town is covered with a thin layer of ashes, so hot when falling that it kills birds. The telegraph linemen report that while repairing line near Anjer early on Monday they saw a high column of sea approaching with a roaring noise. They fled without learning the fate of the inhabitants. Quarries at Merak disappeared, and all people of the place perished. A floating dock at the Island of Onrust, near Batavia, is adrift and badly damaged.

LONDON, Aug. 30.—Particulars of the volcanic eruption in Java show that it was even more disastrous than at first reported. By Sunday noon the disturbances were supposed to be at their height, but later in the day their violence increased, threatening the destruction of the whole island. At midnight suddenly an enormous luminous cloud formed over Kandang Mountain, skirting the south-east coast and gradually spreading until it formed a lurid red canopy. Meanwhile at the eruption increased; streams of lava poured down into the valleys, sweeping all before them. In the midst of the molten sea of lava was a bed of solid ice, emitted from one of the craters, which was carried along and landed at the north-east corner of the island, surrounded by a thick envelope of sand and scoria, which are non-conductors of heat. It is supposed the ice formed the crust of some subterranean lake. At 2 o'clock on Monday morning a great cloud suddenly broke and vanished. At the same time frightful rumblings were heard, and the columns of fire and smoke over the south-east corner of the island ceased to ascend, while the craters in other parts seemed to open their fiery throats still wider. The hissing of the sea became deafening, and the waves rushed up to an unprecedented height. When daylight came an enormous tract of land, fifty miles square, had disappeared, in which were the villages of Negeri and Babawang. None of the natives scattered sparsely through the forests, and on the plains escaped death, and the loss of life must have aggregated 15,000 by fire. The Kandang range of mountains, extending 65 miles, had gone out of sight. The town of Tanagerang, within 25 miles of Batavia, was swept away by a lava stream and half the population, 18,000, perished. At Speelwyck red hot rocks set fire to the houses and swept away all the thickly settled portion of the town. Ten bazars belonging to Europeans were destroyed, but no lives are known to have been lost. The River Jacatara, on which Batavia is situated, is so dammed by lava that its course is changed. Fleganj is almost totally destroyed, and a large number of lives are lost. The Island of Onus, 25 miles east of Batavia, is inundated and the floating dock destroyed. Catayoe, Claps and Tromonis islands are out of sight. Baby and Cheriba islands, on the north coast, are lost; the few houses and inhabitants

upon them being in Batavia. The loss is largely increased since the former reports. The roof of the Governor's house was crushed in by mud and three retainers killed; the town bridge is destroyed, and the Diamond and Pearl bastions damaged. The Buran reed boat is also destroyed. In Cayamand, Malabar and Lion streets, the principal avenues, the damage is very great. Fort Astrog is entirely destroyed. The town of Fagagal is severely shaken, and few buildings are left standing. A violent shock was felt on the Island of Sumatra on Monday. Middah Island, ten miles from the Java coast, is almost wholly engulfed by the sea. The small island of Tingih has disappeared. It was uninhabited. The aggregate loss of life is fully 75,000.

A despatch from Batavia says the condition of the Strait of Sunda is dangerous. New islands have arisen and the coast line altered. The government is preparing to obtain new soundings. Sixteen volcanoes appeared between the site where the Island Krakatoa stood and the Sibisie Island. A portion of Bantam is an ashy desert. Cattle are starving. The population is in despair. Soengpan volcano split into five portions. Seven hundred and four bodies of victims have been buried in the district of Tanara and 300 in the village of Kranat.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 30.—A telegram from Prof. Davidson, assistant superintendent of the coast and Geodetic survey at San Francisco, says:—The earthquake waves commenced in the saualito tide to gauge at 1 o'clock a.m., Aug. 27. They had increased in height yesterday. The height of the waves was about 100 feet, and the time about forty minutes. It is supposed these waves were caused by the earthquake that destroyed Anjer and other towns in Java. There was a similar occurrence on 23rd Dec., 1854, when the town of Simoda in Japan was destroyed and a Russian frigate on three ganges then used on the Pacific coast. Disturbances of a like character were also recorded in August, 1861, when a succession of terrible earthquake waves broke upon the coast of Peru, destroying towns and landing a United States war vessel high and dry.

LONDON, Aug. 31.—Advises from Batavia say that after the sudden subsidence of the volcanic disturbances in the kingdom of Bantam on Monday a feeling of relief was experienced, but at 10 o'clock at night the craters became active again. The Papanayang shot out three distinct columns of flames, and its surface was covered with fiery lava. A whirlwind accompanied the eruption, carrying off houses, trees, men and animals. A shower of ashes covered the roofs of the houses at Denamo. Off Point Cady the floating pumice formed a layer two feet thick, through which the vessels forced their way with great difficulty. The rise of vapour produced the appearance of columns several thousand feet high, based on the edge of the crater. Suddenly the mountain split into seven peaks. In the seams open could be seen great balls of molten matter. From the fissures poured clouds of steam and lava. Exhalations of carbonic acid gas killed birds and animals in large numbers, and a few human beings. The great fissures opened seemed to act as safety valves through which the lava gently flowed into the valley. The fires though still burning at last advice had lost most of their fierceness. One of the queer incidents was the sudden rising on Tuesday of fourteen new volcanic mountains in the straits of Sunda, forming a complete chain in almost a straight line between Point St. Nicholas on the Java coast and Hoga Point on the coast of Sumatra, almost on the tops of what had been the Merak and Middle Islands, which sank into the sea on Monday. In Bantam, where 1500 persons were first supposed to have perished the bodies of 2800 bodies have been recovered. Nine hundred inhabitants of the interior town of Warange were killed, and at Talata, on the coast, 300 bodies have been found. From all over the island come reports of loss of life and property. The estimated 75,000 killed will not prove excessive. On the low lands where the waters receded hundreds of mangled bodies are lying. Sanitary corps have been formed and the corpses are buried as fast as possible.

BATAVIA, Aug. 31.—The captain of a steamer which was in the strait of Sunda during the volcanic eruptions reports that ashes fell on the deck to the depth of 18 inches. He passed masses of floating pumice stone seven feet deep. It is estimated that 10,000 lives were lost at Ijringine. The total killed by the eruption and tidal wave is 30,000.

Woman's Kingdom. A cane-seated chair may be improved by putting upon the back a moveable cushion. One way to accomplish this is to buy a scarlet Turkish towel, fasten a layer of cotton to it, line it with Turkey red calico, catch it at the top of the chair with bows of ribbon, and attach it at the bottom with cords. Patchwork and cretonne is admissible in place of the toweling.

There is a beauty about crystal chandeliers and pendants that cannot be done away with even by fashion, and it is not surprising to see them again coming into use. With additional care in cleaning, the glass may always be bright and the effect brilliant.

A toilet set which is very pretty and tasteful for a birthday gift, is made of blue satin. The set is to consist of a pin-cushion and two mats; line the mats with blue silk, and trim the edge with Valenciennes lace; on one mat work in outline a small horseshoe; work this with olive and pink embroidery silk. Do not put the horseshoe in the centre of the mat, but at one side. The words "Good Luck" should be worked in the rim of the horseshoe. The other mat may be prettily ornamented by embroidering a fan on it. The cushion should have the monogram of the owner, and at each corner put a satin bow, and a full of lace around the edge of the cushion.

A strip of black satin embroidered with some pretty floral device, makes a neat wall panel. If this is supplemented at top and bottom, with bands of crimson and copper color, it adds much to the beauty. A silken cord may be used to suspend it, and balls of silk might be attached to its lower end. The de-

coration of the panel can, of course, be varied as the artist may suggest. Birds, figures, landscapes, and other appropriate things could be substituted for the flowers.
