

## EARLY CABLES.

## BOLSHEVIST SETBACK.

LONDON, May 22. The Allied troops on the North Russia front have carried out a successful turning movement against the main Bolshevik position, forcing the enemy to retreat southwards, according to a Russian official communication received here this evening. Several towns were captured and many prisoners taken and the enemy also suffered heavy casualties.

## WARNING GIVEN.

COBLENZ, May 20. Because of increased indications of friction between German civilians and soldiers throughout the American area of occupation, officers to-day warned the burghers and other German officials that they would be held responsible for any violence or any attempts at destruction of army property.

## WANT WILLIAM BACK.

BERLIN, May 21. The German National People's Party has presented to the National Assembly at Weimar, an appeal signed by many thousands of the party's members, asking that the executive body provide a Government home in Germany for former Emperor William. The party has also telegraphed to President Ebert asking his support of the plan.

## EXPERTS SUMMONED.

VERSAILLES, May 22. The German delegation has summoned from Berlin for a consultation, Carl Kautsky, the German Independent Socialist leader; Herr Pauli, of the German Foreign Office, the head of the German General Electric Co., and other experts who have been called from Berlin. They are expected to-day or to-morrow.

## THE DISPOSITION OF SURPLUS AIRPLANES.

LONDON, May 22. (Reuter's).—In the House of Commons, Col. W. W. Ashley asked if the Overseas Dominions and Colonies would be offered some of the Air Ministry's surplus airplanes for postal and similar services. Hon. J. W. Pratt, Junior Lord of the Treasury, replied that the question of how much assistance can be rendered is now receiving consideration, and it was hoped to announce the decision in a very short time.

## TO ORGANIZE CANADIAN EXPORTS.

LONDON, May 22. (Reuter's).—W. C. Moxon, who is temporarily heading the Canadian mission in London, in the absence of Mr. Lloyd Harris, has gone to Paris to participate in negotiations for the export of large quantities of commodities from Canada to Europe. E. G. Thomson, former Canadian Food Controller, has been appointed a member of the mission.

## LOOKING FOR HELP.

BERNE, May 22. Josef Shumpter, the Finance Minister of German Austria, will shortly be sent to join the Austrian peace delegation at St. Germain, according to a Vienna telegram. ## SINN FEIN PROTEST.

PARIS, May 22. Premier Clemenceau, President of the Peace Conference, has received a letter from Edward De Valera, Count Plunkett and Arthur Griffiths, Irish Sinn Fein leaders, in which they declare that Ireland will not be bound by the action of British delegates on the question of peace. They ask recognition on behalf of Ireland.

## DEATH DEALING EXPLOSION.

CEDAR RAPIDS, Iowa, May 22. Firemen early to-night had removed the bodies of 25 persons killed in an explosion which destroyed the Douglas Starch Works. The fire, which spread to all parts of the plant, is reported as beyond control. The explosion wrecked buildings for a distance of blocks.

## PREVENTED FROM FLYING.

Naval Seaplane N.C.-4 is prevented from leaving Ponta Delgada to-day on account of high winds. The Navy Department received a message from Admiral Jackson this morning saying "N.C.-4 will not leave to-day, as seas too rough for start."

## WANTS MODIFICATION.

VERSAILLES, May 21. The German Independent Socialist leader is here to consult with the German delegation as to the probability of signing the Peace terms unless they can be modified.

## FURTHER DELAY.

PARIS, May 21. (Havas).—The seven days respite allowed the Germans, for signing the Peace Treaty, will likely be spent in pacifying the agitation so foolishly created in Germany. The big interests, independent and majority Socialists, also business men and military authorities, favor signing for fear of Bolshevism. Scheidemann and Noske Cabinet ministers, have compromised the position by exaggerated statements, but the treaty is expected to be signed between June 12 and 16.

## LIVING ON GRASS AND ROOTS.

CONSTANTINOPLE, May 20. Starvation and misery prevails among Armenian refugees in the Caucasus regions, according to the American food commissioners for the Near East, and reports that extreme distress led to cannibalism among the frantic people are probably true. Outside provision must be made for 500,000. Many people are living on grass and roots. The death rate is high among children.

## No More Sea-Sickness.

A new suggestion was made in a recent issue of "Engineering" for the construction of a cabin on passenger steamers that will be unaffected by the motion of the vessel.

A former suggestion was to control the oscillation of a saloon, suspended from a fore-and-aft axis, by means of a gyroscope with a vertical axis of spin.

The latter scheme aims rather at the steadying of the ship than to make a portion of it independent of the general motion. A gyroscope is fixed so that when the ship is on an even keel and the gyroscope is in equilibrium, the axis of the flywheel is vertical. The wheel is pivoted on a frame whose motions are damped by a brake pulley having a graded amount of friction. The action of such a gyroscope is to endow a small ship with the motion of a large one.

## NEW TYPE OF AIRCRAFT MAKES VERTICAL ASCENT.

According to reports from London, Eng., experiments were recently made with a new type of airplane which is called the "Helicopter". The machine is said to be capable of rising and descending vertically, without putting its nose up, and also able to hover in the air. If these reports are correct, another great step has been taken toward the mastery of the air with a heavier-than-air machine.
