For bait a soft kernel is used. When the bird attempts to eat the innocentlooking bait, the trigger is released and the pilferer caught by the head or neck. Death is instantaneous. For the mungo beans, the traps are also for what amount, they are already baited with soft corn and laid on the ground near the plants.
