ONE SOLVES PROBLEM OF WOMEN'S DRESS

Yearning of Religious Emblem With Decolletee Gowns Has Been Difficulty

Milwaukee, May 20.—Archbishop Messmer of Milwaukee in a circular office the women of the church that he Pope has issued a decree which will make it possible for them to wear evening decolletee gowns or peck-a-boo waists. The edict permits women of the church to carry their scalars in their pockets and "where they please," the reason for the edict being to permit women to dress as the custom of society dictates.

Hitherto it has been impossible for Roman Catholic women who wear the scalars to don evening clothes, for the scalars is not designed as an artistic and would not harmonize with the ordinary decolletee corsage. Catholic women for years have found the wearing of the scalars uncomfortable when wearing low-cut gowns, the brown cord being ugly as well as not pleasing when seen against a pair of white shoulders.

The Pope's letter follows: "The holy father, always interested in the affairs of his children, is desirous that Catholic women who take an active part in social affairs be not restricted in the dress proper for social requirements by any open sign of their faith, and therefore dispenses them from the obligation of scalars where they will be conspicuous, or doing away with them altogether if they desire. This edict, however, does not mean that they need not be enrolled in the order, for that obligation still holds, but after they are once enrolled they may put aside the scalars and wear instead a small model of the Blessed Virgin in their pockets or wherever they please."

KOOTENAY CENTRAL TO BE BUILT THIS YEAR

C.P.R. to Call for Tenders for Construction at the South End

Winnipeg, May 20.—An early start in the construction of the Kootenay Central Railway is indicated by the decision of the C.P.R. to immediately call for tenders for the work. It is reported that the bids will be required to be in the hands of the office of the company in this city by the end of the present month. It is understood that this means the starting of the work this summer.

At the outset, but twenty-five or thirty miles of work will be awarded and contrary to general expectation construction will be started on the south end of the line instead of in the vicinity of Golden at the northern end. Several years ago ten miles of grading was done south from Golden on the main line of the C.P.R. but the steel was never laid on that section.

The Kootenay Central, following the valleys of the Upper Columbia and Kootenay rivers will follow the main line of the C.P.R. with the Crow's Nest branch, traversing a valley reputed to be rich in mineral and agricultural resources.

At its southern end the railway will join the Crow's Nest Pass branch at a point some miles to the east of Cranbrook near the line of the C.P.R. by the citizens of Cranbrook with a view to having that town made the junction point. The company caused surveys to be made but it was found that the route to Cranbrook was impracticable and Galloway will be made the junction. From Galloway the road will follow the valley of the Kootenay to Canal Flat past Upper Columbia Lake and down the Upper Columbia River to Golden.

TIMBER BARGAIN IS COMPLETED

Negotiations for Purchase of Cowichan Lake Timber Lands by Americans Brought to Conclusion

Victoria, May 20.—A deal involving the expenditure of over \$1,500,000, the transfer of some 54,000 acres of timber land in the Cowichan lake district from the Esquimalt and Nanaimo Railway company to the American Finance company of New York, the construction of 20 miles of railway and the erection of a large export sawmill on tidewater on the east coast of Vancouver island, has just been concluded. Negotiations in connection with this transaction have been pending for over eight months, and were only completed the latter part of last week.

The timber lands are all tributary to Cowichan lake, and when logging is started, the timber will be rafted and towed from the points where it is put in the water to the foot of the lake, where it will be loaded on flat cars and carried over the extension of the Esquimalt and Nanaimo railway to the big mill to be erected at tidewater. The agreement between the American Finance company and the railway company provides for the construction by the latter of a line of railway from a point on its main line near Duncan to Cowichan lake, and another line from a point on the main line to tidewater, where the mill will be located. The railway is to be completed and ready for operation by next year. The mill will be built and operated by the Empire Lumber company, financed by American capital.

The railway will be built under Dominion charter, which carries with it the usual subsidy. Under these circumstances the line will conform to the required federal standards and will be a common carrier under the act.

This railway will be a big factor in the development of that portion of the eastern half of Vancouver island which it will traverse. Between tidewater on the east coast and the shores of Cowichan lake there is a large area of exceptionally fine agricultural land which has never been opened up because of its inaccessibility. Given transportation, this land will be rapidly settled, to the general advantage of the Cowichan district and of the province, particularly to which locality it is tributary.

ALASKA GOLD RUSH

Big Preparations Being Made at Fairbanks—Two Thousand Prospectors

Fairbanks, Alaska, May 20.—The ice began to break at Fairbanks yesterday and before the end of the week navigation will begin on the Tanana and the lower Yukon. The first boats are scheduled to leave Fairbanks Thursday and with their departure will begin the big stampede to the interior gold fields, discovered late last fall.

Two thousand prospectors have made arrangements to go to the interior country. With fourteen large steamers and hundreds of small craft tied up at the wharves ready to sail, the water front of Fairbanks resembles a vast shipyard. Machinery for use in the new goldfields has been piling up on the docks all winter and now forty

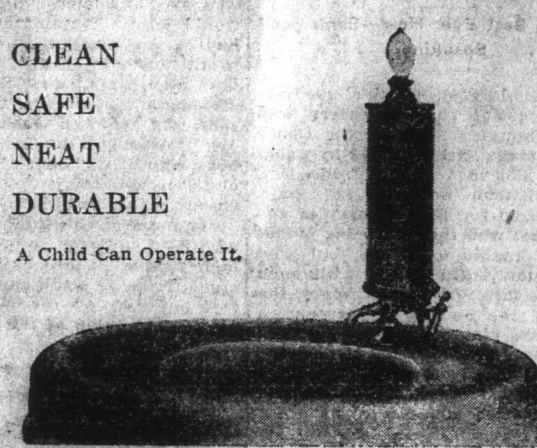
