FARMERS ARE BUSY

RUSHING SEEDING

Fine Rain Has Made the Land in

Splendid Shape for Work.

Lambeth, April 24.—Farmers all

through this district are very busy

with their work, and are making great

progress as a result of the splendid

weather conditions. Many farmers say

that this spring the fruit buds are

developing rapidly and were unhurt by

the recent frosts. All the small fruits

showed the winter well. The recent

showers came most opportunely, as the

land was beginning to need rain. It is

at present in splendid shape for the

seed that is being done.

Mr. John Pincombe, who for some

time has been pathmaster for the west-

erly part of Brick street, has resigned

his position, and is now farming, on

the second concession. Mr. Pincombe

resided for some time in New Ontario,

and has travelled extensively, but

says there is no land like that in Mid-

dlesex.

TWO HOTELS CUT

OFF IN COUNTY

Graham License Refused by

Commissioners After Protest

Comes.

BIRR HOUSE ALSO GOES

Third License Withheld Until After

Investigation Has Been

Made.

The board of license commissioners

for East Middlesex, at the meeting held

in St. George's Hall on Wednesday

afternoon, decided to discontinue after

May 1, the licenses of Benjamin J.

Graham, proprietor of the hotel on the

Hamilton road east of the city limits,

and Richard De Coursey, who keeps

the hotel at Birr, Elias Blake, the

holder of the license at Elginfield, was

given a three-months' extension, and

Inspector Thomas Duffin will investi-

gate certain complaints upon the man-

ner in which the house is conducted.

Against Graham License.

The holders of the seven licenses in

East Middlesex made application for

renewals, but delegations spoke against

the granting of licenses to the two

hotels, which were ultimately cut off.

Mr. De Coursey stated that as

the people in the neighborhood of Gra-

ham's hotel had shown a decided feel-

ing in favor of local option at the elec-

tion last January by a vote of 23 to 7,

and thought that this should have some

bearing on the question.

Mr. J. Cornell stated that the resi-

dents of Birr and vicinity were strong-

ly against the granting of a license to

Mr. De Coursey, but that the situation

of a hotel in that village was not

against the feeling of the people.
