## REFUSE LICENSES TO HOTELKEEPERS IN LONDON ANNEX

Inspector Galpin Is Warmly Praised by Prof. Bowman and Chairman Greer.

Three City License Holders Notified That They Must Make Repairs.

It was decided at a meeting of the icense commissioners of London, held Wednesday afternoon, to grant 23 of the 26 licenses issued in the city prior to annexation, and to give the other hree holders three months in which to nake certain repairs to their houses demanded by the commissioners. If at the end of that time the requests are not made the licenses will be cut off. The applications for licenses made by Mr. James Homister, of the Homister House, Hamilton road, and Mr. W. Barnes, of the Barnes Hotel, Pottersburg, who came into the city with an-

nexation, were refused. Those given the three months' extension were: Mr. J. Young, of the Duke of York Hotel; Mr. W. Wright, of the Metropolitan Hotel, and Mrs. Walper, of the Walper House. All the shop licenses, including wholesale license, were renewed. A deputation from the temperance ocieties of the city, consisting of Rev Dr. McCrae, Rev. W. G. Riddiford, Professor J. H. Bowman, C. E. Finch and Mr. Charles Tupholme appeared before the commissioners to enter a protest against granting a license to any hote in the recently-annexed districts.

Most People Against It.

"We do not think a hotel on the Hamilton road is necessary, and as a vast majority of the citizens are against it, we have come to ask you o refuse to grant a license," said Rev.

Prof. James H. Bowman took the floor, and said that the delegates wanted to congratulate the commissioners on the way they did their work in London during the past year. "You have handled the affairs of the license department in excellent manner," said e, "and your inspector has been especially active. I do not think the newswork he does. We only wish that this board had jurisdiction over some other sections of the county, because we fee sure that some conditions which exi at present would soon be remedied. Says Some Are Bad.

"We have come here to prote against the granting of licenses either of the hotels in the recently-an nexed districts, because we do not thin they are necessary. 
