Martial Law Will Cease To-day and Civil Authorities Resume Control.

Galveston, Texas, Sept. 20.—This evening Mayor Jones proclaimed that martial law would cease to-morrow noon and the civil authorities would assume direction of morrows. martial law would case to-morrow nown and the civil authorities would assume direction of municipal affairs. This was done at the suggestion of Gen. Scurry, who expressed the belief that conditions had reached such a stage that the civil authorities were able to cope with the situation. Since martial law has prevailed in Galveston, good order has resulted. It was found in some quarters that when it became known that the militia had given way to civil law, the looting and robbery which began after the storm and continued until the declaration of martial law, might commence. The military forces will be used as a check on this character of crime, however, and will in all probability remain here for the next twenty days. The shooting of negroes by military men for looting has had a most salutary effect, and has in a measure terrorized the offenders; still there are cases of robbery reported daily, that are being dealt with severely.
