

the father of Sir Alexander Galt, and the celebrated Dr. Dunlop of Scotland were agents about the year 1828. That tract of land extended from Guelph through most of the townships west of it in the counties of Perth, Huron, Lambton, Middlesex and other places. The land was sold to the company for about twenty-five cents an acre. The grant was a monstrous mono-poly and recarded the settlement of west-ern Ontario, and still criterio ern Ontario, and still exists in a small way.

It put millions of dollars into the pockets of English stockholders and made temporary tenants of thousands of hard-worked set tlers who worked up the value of the land so bought for English owners. So now Sir John and his cabinet are creating and fos-tering the same state of things in the Northwest country. The result of the recent tory elections is put down as an approval of this policy. I could describe even better than Mr. Phipps has so clearly done in his said letter the hardships of the old Ontario settlers in their new lands from 1820 to 1850. My father was a large farmer during part of this time, owning in the vicinity of Brantford 1250 acres, and I in 1832 rode on horseback over the lands of the Canada on horseback over the lands of the Canada company in many townships in the vicinity of Guelph, which was then only a little hamlet. The country about that now large city was then a wilderness full of wild ani-mals. My account of this ride is still ex-tant in the shape of a diary in the woods. It would seem the object of the Ottawa gov-ernment is to get rid of all the public lands in the Northwestas soon as possible, and that chiefly to companies, home and foreign, who buy at a small figure to retail at a large one to settlers who may come in after this. This is a fatal policy and one likely to be abueed. The rejection of the bpposition in the late elections has fixed the policy until the settlers in the west arise and put it down.

Whether such a policy shall continue

Whether such a policy shall containe or not will depend on our local elections in Ontario in 1883.
