

PEOPLE DRINKING LIE TEA

CANADA GETTING IMMENSE SHIP-

MENTS OF THE COMPOUND.

This Season So Far is Spurious-Coak Dust, Glue, Sand and Gypsum Are Mixed With It by the Wicked Celes-

More than half of the Ping Suey tea imported this season is adulterated. Scarcely half the season has elapsed, and the incoming aird crops, and even more wholesale aduleration is expected in the near future. Already more bad tea has been imported this

ready more bad tea has been imported this season than in any other similar period in a century. In fact, it is stated that already there has been more bad tea sent to Canada this season than she can dispose of, even if she prefers bad tea to good.

Ping Suey tea forms about 9 per cent. of the total importation of tea to this country in an average year.

In a general way Ping Suey teas may be said to be gunpowder teas, but all gunpowder teas are not Ping Suey and all Ping Suey teas are not adulterated.

The blame for the importation of adulterated teas lies on the Chinese.

The following frank confession of adulteration, with a cheerful hint as to its nature and mode of detection, as well as a suggestion for a remedy for the fraud, was published in an English paper of Shanghaf which arrived recently:

hence diligence and care should be observed in its preparation. But it is a matter for regret that the manufactures of Ping Suey tee have been most conspicuous by the absence of the above-named qualities.

Chinese merchants, in their greed for gain, unscrupulously use a paste compound of coal dust, glue, sand and gypsum, which is mixed with the true article and then sold to consumers. To cover their frauds they use various names for various brands and bearing names of hongs which it would be difficult to detect. This has been going on foremany years.

many years.

In the present case, for instance, the teasurus of Ping Suey were partially destroyed by the cold snap of last winter, therefore the yield this year should be greatly curtailed. As a matter of fact, only about 100,000 cheats should be on the marketthis year, yet the quantity appears to be just as great as in the flourishing seasons of former years. mer years.
We have heard that spurious tea was re We have heard that spurious tea was refused an entrance into the United States
recently. This is a step in the right direction, and its example should be followed whenever such a thing happens in every foreign
country. The spurious article should be returned to Shanghai, and the sellers here be
forced to refund the money as well as pay
for the expenses that have been incurred by
the buyers, and the tea burned in public as a
marging to native dealers.
