BROOKE COUNCIL.

Alvinston, Sept. 22nd, 1906
Council met pursuant to adjournment. Members all present.

Minutes of previous meeting read, and on motion of Spearman and Monroe were approved.
Mr. Daneau Fisher asked council to finish concrete tile for a culvert in a drain made across his farm as an outlet for waters from side-road, drain of no use to him. Council agreed to pay for the tile.

Mr. John McGregor stated that since last winter and until the completion of new bridge on side-road parties have been driving across and through his farm, and claimed \$95 for remuneration for damages and trouble.

Mr. Geo. Campbell put in a claim similar to Mr. McGregor's, also claiming \$25.00. They were each paid \$20.

Spearman—McIntyre, that bylaws for the following drains be read a third time and finally passed: Smith drain, Gray drain, Dolbear McKellar drain, and Warden McKellar drain.—Carried, read and passed.

R. S. Code, township engineer, asked to be relieved of his duties as engineer.

Spearman—McIntyre, that resignation of R. S. Code as township engineer be accepted, and that A. S. Code be appointed to fill the vacancy; also to attend the surveys of Zavitz Campbell and S. 9 con. drains. Clerk to prepare the required bylaws authorizing these changes.—Carried.

Wm. Fleming applied for remuneration for one lamb killed by dogs, valued at \$5.50, and Ellis Augustine for pay for 1 lamb killed and 4 injured, valued at \$14.00.

Spearman—Monroe, that Mr. Fleming be paid the sum of \$3.66, and Mr. Augustine \$9.33.—Carried.

Bylaw was introduced to levy and collect pro-rata the sum of \$1225 on lots and roads assessed under bylaws No. 25 of 1894 and nine of 1898, for the costs of the McClure-Bryce suit.

Kelly—Monroe, that bylaw be given its first reading.—Carried and read.
McIntyre—Spearman, that bylaw levying the sum of \$992.51 pro-rata on lots and roads assessed for the repairs to 12-13 side-road drain to meet the deficit for said work, be read a third time and finally passed.—Carried, read and passed.

Bylaw introduced and read to provide the sum of \$509.00, to be paid to the township of Warwick, as Brooke's share of the assessment for the McGill drain.

Spearman—Monroe, that bylaw be provisionally adopted, printed in pamphlet form, and copies served upon each of the parties assessed, with notice that a Court of

Revision on same would be held in the hall, Inwood, on Saturday, the 27th day of October, 1906, at 2 o'clock p. m. Mr. Kelly to serve bylaws.—Carried.

Spearman—McIntyre, that bylaw to authorize the levy and collection pro-rata of the McClure-Bryce suit, be read a second time and ordered to be printed in pamphlet form and copies thereof served on each of the parties assessed with notice that a Court of Revision on same would be opened in the village of Inwood, on Saturday, the 27th day of October, 1906, at 4 o'clock a. m. Mr. Kelly to serve bylaws.—Carried.

L. Lindsey, ex-reeve, handed in his report as commissioner on the completion of the repairs to the following drains under his charge:

Table with financial data: Pray drain—Receipts from debentures \$437 80, Due from Alvinston on drain 21 00, Expended on drain 478 80, 618 40.

Table with financial data: Deficit \$139 60, 15-16 Sideroad drain—Proceeds of debentures \$276 80, Due from Alvinston 29 00, 886 00, Expenditures 1491 63.

Table with financial data: Deficit \$605 63, McIntyre—Darvill, that reports be accepted, and clerk instructed to prepare bylaws, levying pro-rata the deficits on the lots and roads assessed for the several drains and as the deficit on the 15-16 sideroad drain is large that it be divided into three annual payments without interest.—Carried.

Acceptance of tenders received for the repairs and construction of drains was left to the several commissioners.

McIntyre—Kelly, that the Reeve and Treasurer be authorized to arrange for an additional loan of \$3000 to meet current expenditures and debentures falling due.—Carried.

Table with financial data: The following estimate of expenditures was submitted. To County Rates \$4166 56, Money borrowed 8000 00, Grant of \$300 to each S. S. 6042 13, Steel bridges and culverts 3000 00, Division expenditures 1500 00, General expenses 1000 00, Township's share drainage 900 00, Level for roads 900 00, Officers' salaries 900 00, Keep of inmates, H. of R. 375 00, Interest on borrowed money 300 00.

Table with financial data: Total \$27084 69, Deduct Co. rate 4167 56, \$22917 13.

By rate of .009 on assessment of \$2,466, 200—\$22919 00.

Kelly—Monroe, that blanks in bylaw to levy annual rates be filled with a rate of half a mill in the dollar to meet payment of steel bridge debenture No. 5, one and seven-tenths of a mill in the dollar, to meet payment of county rates; and nine mills in the dollar to meet township expenditures, and that bylaw be read a third time and finally passed.—Carried.

Spearman—Monroe, that council do now adjourn so meet in the village of Inwood on Saturday, the 27th day of October, 1906.—Carried.
