Committee on Supplements.

Rev. T. Sedgewick read the report of the committee on supplement The report was adopted, with instruction to Presbyteries to be more sta gent in requiring that the congregational payments be made before supplement be paid. And farther, that Presbyteries be directed to with such supplemented congregations as are numerous and able to a port ordinances, so as to bring them up to the position of self-susta ing congregations.

Systematic Beneticence.

Rev. Wm. Murray next read the report of the committee on System Beneficence, which was adopted with the following recommendations

That Presbyteries enjoin Sessions to bring the whole subject before the gregations under their inspection in such way as they think best.

That ministers be directed to preach or lecture on the subject during they That the committee be authorized to prepare a small circular stating the ciple and method of scriptural proportionate giving, to which subscription lists be attached, and to forward them to sessions for the use of the collectors.

Psalmody.

Rev. Mr. McKnight read the report of the committee on Psalmo shewing that they had under consideration the manuscript copy of volume of sacred vocal music to be called the "The Mayflower," when they considered well adapted to the wants of the church. The commi recommended that attention be called by presbyteries to the state of a gregational psalmody in congregations under their charge, at presbyte visitations, and for this purpose that a question be added to those no use, enquiring how the psalmody of the congregation is conducted, what means are being used for its improvement. The report was aded, the question just named referred to the committee having the questi in charge, and the committee re-appointed with the addition of Mr. Jaj Hepburn, of Pictou.

Preebyterial Records, l'ruro.

Rev. D. S. Gordon read the report of the committee to examine minutes of Truro and Cape Breton Presbyteries. The committee point out some small omissions in minutes of Truro presbytery, but repo that in general the minutes were correctly kept and business regul Ordered that the minutes be attested. conducted. The commi further pointed out irregularities in the keeping of the minutes and conducting of business of the Presbytery of Cape Breton. was agreed that the serious attention of the Presbytery be called these errors, and that for the present they be not attested.

Rev. W.R. Frame read the report of committee appointed to exam the minutes of the Presbyteries of Halifax and Tatamagouche, she Tatamagouche that the records of these Presbyteries were accurately kept and busin regularly conducted. Ordered that these records be attested.
