BOILING WATER IN PAIER.—"Nature is publishing a seried by attractive articles as "Physics without Apparatus." In the later number are given experiments, for boiling water and melting lead on a piece of pape. Take a piece of paper and fold it up, a schoolboys do, into a square box without lid. Hang this up to a walking-stick by four threads, and support the stick uper hooks or other convenient props. Then lamp or taper must be placed under the dainty cauldron. In a few minutes the water will boil. The only fear is lest the threads should catch fire, and let the water threads should catch fire, and let the water spill into the lamp and over the table. The flame must therefore not be too large. The paper does not burn, because it is wet; and even if it resisted the wet, it still would as even if it resisted the wet, it still would as burn through, because the heat imparted to it on one side by the flame would be very rapidly conducted away by the water on the other. Another experiment of a similar nature, but perhaps even more striking, is a follows: Twist up the edges of a common playing-card, or other bit of cardboard, so us to fashion it into a light tray. On this tray place a layer of small shot or bits of lead, and heat it over the flame of a lamp. The lead will melt, but the card will not burn. It may be changed a little around the edge, but immediately below the lead conducts of the heat on one side as fast as it is supplied on the other.
