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### HOW TO SPEND A HOLIDAY.

A GOOD many hard-worked Torontonians can't afford either the time or the money for an extended summer vacation. An occasional "day off" is the extent of their holidaying. To such people a pointer as to the best way of spending a single holiday is valuable. Here is one: Take one of the Hamilton Steamboat Company's boats leaving Toronto in the morning—either the one that leaves at 7:30 or the one that leaves at 11. The first arrives at Hamilton Beach at about 10 o'clock, and the second a little after 1 o'clock. The sail to the Beach is delightfully invigorating, and just long enough to be pleasant without being tiresome. You can stay at the Beach for an hour or two and inspect this beautiful and interesting resort, the summer home of hundreds of Hamiltonians, and then take one of the company's boats to the city, sailing up the picturesque land-locked bay. At the Hamilton wharf electric cars always meet the boats, and on one of these you will be whirled up into the city and through it to the foot of the mountain, where you can take the incline railway and be hauled to the mountain top. From this eminence one of the most magnificent views in America is obtained—the city at your feet, and the beautiful bay spread out like a panorama behind it, while far to the east stretches the long low line of the beach with the blue waters of the lake sparkling beyond it. This scene is worth travelling from Toronto to view. There are conveniences for picnickers on the mountain top, and a pleasant hour or two can be spent there, for it is always cool up there. The evening boat, leaving Hamilton at 5:30, lands you in Toronto at 8:15. You can go from Toronto to the top of the Hamilton mountain and back to Toronto without the necessity of walking more than a few minutes altogether. This is the ideal summer day's outing.

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
