

afternoon and answer them in detail, because I submit that they have been answered already.

In closing I would just take note of the fact that the parliamentary assistant suggested that the Minister of Finance is going to give consideration in preparing for his forthcoming budget to all suggestions that are brought to his attention. The parliamentary assistant did not say it, but I could read between the lines the suggestion that in view of that fact perhaps as the member who had moved this resolution I might see fit not to press it to a vote.

I am not brand new around here. I have been here long enough to know that you do not get things in that way. I know that the best way to ensure that the minister's consideration of this matter will be active and perhaps favourable is by a large vote for it by the private members of this house. I hope that when the vote is called—and I shall ask that a vote be taken on the matter; I do not think there was ever any doubt of that in anyone's mind—it will carry. If it does not carry I hope that at least there will be half a dozen or more brave Liberals who will stand up and vote for it.

An hon. Member: All Liberals are brave.

Mr. Knowles: Even though they may be a minority I suggest that a few Liberals standing up and voting for this motion would speak volumes to the Minister of Finance and tell him to make that consideration very serious. This way we might get results.

I am very pleased to recall the vocal support we have had for this proposal on the floor of the house in days gone by from such friends of mine as the hon. member for Skeena (Mr. Applewhaite), the hon. member for Portneuf (Mr. Gauthier), the hon. member for Charlevoix (Mr. Maltais), the hon. member for Rosedale (Mr. Henry) and the hon. member for Spadina (Mr. Croll). I hope these hon. members and others will join with us who intend to vote for this resolution which I now commend to the house.
