Just because it happened that the tail seemed to be wagging the dog on those two particular days does not mean this is not a very serious request. There should at least be some answer directly from the Prime Minister (Mr. Trudeau) as to whether or not a study is merited or whether sufficient information is being amassed behind the scenes to meet Mr. Lucien Saulnier's request. Be that as it may, I suggest that in dealing with the legislation before us now, and in dealing with the imposition of a financial comptroller, the interim measure should be sufficient to protect what money is still left in the till of the CYC. That is why we support the proposal that this measure be effective until March 31, 1970, to keep faith with the taxpayers who have put up this money. In this respect, the Conservatives agree with the government members.

I suggest that no surgery by the government, however skilled, can cure the CYC, judging from last week end's meeting of the CYC when it fell apart in many different directions. There were resignations here and there and power plays all over the place. One project was continued because it was anti-establishment and not because anybody could prove that it had the least bit of reality or common sense about it. When you see that sort of thing going on you suspect that the rot is so ingrained in the organization there is no hope for it. You cannot just chop out a part here or there and do a transplant. This matter cannot be cured by a heart transplant, a brain transplant or any other kind of transplant. I think it is a matter for mercy killing at the earliest opportunity, and then, after a proper study, a new measure could be presented which the committee, with the experience it has had so far, could take a hard look at and report upon. What we have now, Sir, is simply unsatisfactory.
