Hon. E. J. Benson (Minister of Finance): Mr. Speaker, I am sure my hon. friend is speaking about 1971. I have said it is an objective. It is not necessarily binding. Mr. Benson: To my knowledge the drafting of the bill is not under way.

Mr. Stanfield: Can the minister give the House the assurance that the drafting of the bill will not commence until after the committee has reported?

Mr. Benson: Until the committees have reported it will be impossible to draft the precise bill because we are going to look at the recommendations of the committees and I suspect, take action of course, on some of those recommendations.

Mr. Stanfield: Mr. Speaker, I should like to ask the minister when we may expect his proposals to overcome the difficulties which he has admitted his white paper proposals will create for small businesses, although when he recognized these difficulties he said he did not have any proposals but hoped somebody else would have. Has he discovered that somebody else has come up with proposals?

Mr. Benson: Mr. Speaker, a great many submissions have been received from individuals and organizations and these are presently being studied. As I indicated publicly, I have also asked my department to look into the financial problems of small businesses.
