TRANSPORT COMMISSION STUDY OF BELL CANADA STRUCTURE—SUGGESTED DEFERMENT OF COMPANY RATE INCREASE APPLICATIONS

Mr. Arnold Peters (Timiskaming): I have a question for the Minister of Communications, Mr. Speaker. Is the minister aware of the statement made by his counterpart in Ontario who indicated that there would be a federal inquiry by the Canadian Transport Commission into the Bell structure? If this has been set up, when are the hearings going to be held?

Hon. Robert Stanbury (Minister of Communications): Mr. Speaker, some weeks ago the Canadian Transport Commission announced a study somewhat along the lines mentioned by the Ontario minister. I think the details of it are of public record.

Mr. Peters: Would the minister, who is responsible for that section of the Canadian Transport Commission's decisions that affect communications, give consideration to delaying the two or three applications that Bell now has before the commission for rate increases until this inquiry is conducted?

Mr. Stanbury: I might, Mr. Speaker, except that the minister does not have authority to delay any such consideration.

Mr. Peters: May I ask the minister, who represents members of parliament in dealing with the commission, whether he will convey to the commission the request made in Ontario and the request being made now by members of parliament to have these rate increases delayed until the conclusion of that inquiry?

Mr. Stanbury: Mr. Speaker, I think it should be clear, unless I am mistaken, that the minister in Ontario did not request a delay in any consideration of existing applications, but I will be glad to convey the suggestion of the hon. member to the chairman of the CTC.

BELL CANADA RATES FOR PRIVATE LINE CONSTRUCTION

Mr. W. C. Scott (Victoria-Haliburton): I have a supplementary question, Mr. Speaker. When the minister is making this inquiry would he also inquire into Bell rates for private line construction to customers who have to build lines under the supervision of Bell?

Hon. Robert Stanbury (Minister of Communications): Again, Mr. Speaker, this comes under the authority of the Canadian Transport Commission. The authority was given to them by parliament. I would be glad to draw the hon. member's inquiry to the attention of the chairman of the CTC.
