**Mr. Speaker:** Presenting reports from standing and special committees. Tabling of documents.

**Mr. Joe Clark (Leader of the Opposition):** Mr. Speaker, I rise on a point of order. As Your Honour will recall, the question of privilege was raised by the Minister of Finance before the end of the question period. In all fairness to the House of Commons, I think Your Honour would want to grant parliament the opportunity to have at least the seven or eight minutes left in the question period.

**Mr. Erik Nielsen (Yukon):** As I understand the rules, Mr. Speaker, questions of privilege and points of order are reserved if matters arise during question period until three o'clock when question period is terminated. Without intending in any way to be critical of the Chair, the fact remains that the Minister of Finance raised a question of privilege prior to three o'clock. It should not have been heard at the time it was heard. It should have been heard at three o'clock.
