CATALOGUE OF CANADIAN BIRDS.

Sterna hirundo.

COMMON TERN.

An abundant summer resident from Lake Manitoba to the Atlantic, and from the Great Lakes to the Fur Countries. Winters from Virginia south.

Sterna paradisæa.

ARCTIC TERN.

Occurs throughout the entire Dominion, but is most abundant on the Atlantic coast, and rather rare in the interior.

Sterna dougalli.

ROSEATE TERN.

A southern bird that sometimes wanders up to the Great Lakes, and has been seen occasionally near the mouth of the Bay of Fundy. One was taken near Halifax in 1868.

Sterna antillarum.

LEAST TERN.

A few examples of this species have been observed in Lake Ontario, and along the Atlantic coast as far north as Labrador, but these were merely accidental stragglers from the south.

Hydrochelidon nigra surinamensis. BLACK TERN.

This species occurs regularly throughout the Dominion, from Montreal to the Pacific coast, being most abundant in Western Ontario and Manitoba. The only Atlantic coast record is of three specimens taken at Grand Manan, in August, 1879 (*Ruthven Deane*).
