REGULATE RIGHTS TO DIVERT POWER

Congress Committee Agree on Compromise Measure Relating to Niagara Falls.

Canadian Press Dispatch. WASHINGTON, May 13.—A compromise bill to regulate the water-power development at Niagara Falls was agreed upon at a conference today between Secretary of War Garrison and Representatives Harrison, Cline and Cooper, representing the house committee on foreign affairs. The bill gives the secretary of war the right to issue revocable permits for a daily discharge averaging 15,000 cubic feet per second on the American side and for the importation of 250,000 horsepower from the Canadian side.

The control of water rates, tolls and service would be left to the State of New York.

STEAM COLLIER SANK

FIVE MEN DROWNED

Boat Turned Turtle in North Sea—Sixteen Sailors Saved.
