An Act for the relief of Marie Marguerite Cecile Gagnon Lescadres.

WHEREAS Marie Marguerite Cecile Gagnon Lescadres, residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of

Quebec, housekeeper, wife of Joseph Arthur Eugene Lescadres, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the said city, has by her petition alleged that they were married on 5 the twenty-ninth day of October, A.D. 1928, at the city of Sherbrooke, in the said province, she then being Marie Marguerite Cecile Gagnon, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said 10 marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of

Preamble.

Marriage dissolved. 1. The said marriage between Marie Marguerite Cecile Gagnon and Joseph Arthur Eugene Lescadres, her husband is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Canada, enacts as follows:----

Right to marry again. 2. The said Marie Marguerite Cecile Gagnon may at 20 any time hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Joseph Arthur Eugene Lescadres had not been solemnized.
