A PROPOSAL for an additional Bounty on the Exportation of all British Sugars to foreign Markets, with Observations thereon.

T will be impossible to regain the supplying of foreign Markets with Sugar, a Trade that the French have insensibly gain'd from us, without falling on some extraordinary Measures; and therefore, it is proposed, That a Bounty be granted on all Sugars, of the Growth of our Islands, that shall be carry'd to foreign Markets from Great Britain, or the Sugar Islands, to the Amount of 18,000 l. Sterling per Annura (as an Experiment) to be paid in Course, as attested Copies of the feveral Debentures shall be lodg'd at the Custom-House at London.

OBSERVATIONS.

N. B. The one Third Subfidy on Sugar amounts to about this Sum. Suppose then the Bounty should be 2 s. 6 d. Sterling per Hundred Weight, and that 12,000 Hogsheads, at 12 Hundred Weight each, should be sent to foreign 18,000 Markets, one Year with another, the Bounty will be no more per Annum than The Value of these 12,000 Hogsheads, at 25 s. per Hundred Weight, will amount to 180,000 l. Sterling, which will be return'd to Great Britain; and, according to the common Course of the Sugar Trade, may be computed as follows, viza
