Provided that the powers vested in the Governor in Council by section 9 of 49 Vic., cap. 33, shall extend and apply in all respects to the above named articles and that the Governor in Council may increase the export duty on pine logs to three dollars per thousand feet, board measure. 49 V., c. 27, s. 4.
