a systematic course of education, by which the intellectual powers are gradually developed, and at the same time the mind is stored with information in the various branches of Knowledge.—
The Young Gentlemen's Department comprises all the studies usually pursued in Colleges, in addition to the various branches of an English Education.

The following are the outlines of the course of study in the Male Department:

JUVENILE DEPARTMENT.

Spelling, Reading, Introductory Arithmetics, and Geographies, Writing, Pinnock's Catechism of Geography, Irving's Catechisms of the Histories of various Nations, English Grammar and the elements of Natural Philosophy. In this Department are taught the elementary principles of correct reading and declamatian, and the construction of Maps. As an exercise in the definition and use of words, and the structure of language, the pupils are daily required to incorporate in sentences to be written by them, words given them by their teachers.

The Junior Students are under the eye of their Teachers, who have the supervision, not only of their education, but also of their habits and morals.

COMMERCIAL DEPARTMENT.

This department is intended for boys, who have made some progress in elementary studies, but who are not to take the Greek or Latin course. To such pupils will be given as thorough a preparation, as through the English and Modern Languages can be imparted, for the ac-
